WHY IS ART IMPORTANT?

This is an interesting question. The value of art is very subjective and you are the only one who knows if a piece of art holds value to you.



I would recommend that you purchase from an upcoming artist. The art will be less expensive and you will be supporting an independent artist.



A LITTLE INFORMATION ABOUT ART PRINTS

IF YOU CANNOT AFFORD TO BUY AN ORIGINAL I WOULD RECOMMEND GETTING THE NEXT BEST THING - A LIMITED EDITION PRINT.

Limited edition prints are worth more than normal art prints because they are limited in numbers, meaning that when the edition sells out, the print will never get reprinted again. The smaller the edition quantity the more valuable the print could turn out to be.



If you find value in the aesthetics of an art print rather than how much money it is worth, then it is not necessary to purchase a limited edition. The quality of the print should not depend on whether it is a limited edition or not. To get a good quality art print you need to make sure that you are purchasing a fine art print, also called a giclee print. Giclee prints are printed on thick art paper with archival inks, which makes the print stand out and last longer.
